Feast of San Gennaro - Patron Saint of Naples, is held along Mulberry St. between Canal and Houston St. in Little Italy. There's wonderful food, great people watching, and fun things to buy. This celebration is based on Neapolitan religious tradition. Of the restaurants, Umberto's Clam House on Mulberry St. remains most famed, not for the food, but for the fact it was the scene of a vicious gangland murder in 1972, when Joe "crazy Joey" was shot dead while celebrating his birthday with his wife and daughter. Be sure to check the old Police Headquarters - a palatial neoclassical confection with high-rise dome and lavish ornamentation, located on Center & Broome St.
